# HEALTH CARE CENTERS

The health care centre in the neighborhood provides varied health care services. It is possible to book appointment with a doctor, get consultation by nurse and make phone appointment. "Walk-in" service is for abrupt illnesses and minor accident. Here you can find the localization and opening hours of the nearest health care centre www.heilsuvera.is/kort

The opening hours of the health care centres is different over the country but in the capital area the opening hour is weekdays 8-16. You can choose if you are registered at the local health clinic or at a private health clinic.

If you need a translator, it is good when you book an appointment with a doctor or nurse, you let know you need such service and which language you need.

#### **DENTAL HEALTH**

Please note that all dental treatment for children is fully paid by Icelandic Health Insurance, apart from a 3.500.- ISK annual registration fee. If your child has not received dental care in the last 12 months you are requested to make an appointment with a dentist as soon as possible.

ÞRÓUNARMIÐSTÖÐ ÍSLENSKRAR HEILSUGÆSLU The school health care is part of the primary health care service and a continuation of the pediatric health care. The goal of school health care is to promote the schoolchildren's health and well-being.

The school nurses work in collaboration with parents/guardians, school administrators, teachers, and other professionals in children's welfare system

#### **HEALTH EDUCATION**

School children's health protection provides organized health education and encourages healthy lifestyles either in groups or on an individual basis. On the website heilsuvera.is you can access various health-related information.

#### HEALTH ASESSMENT AND SCREENING

Health assessment and screening takes place in 1., 4., 7. and 9. grade. The screening includes simple eye test and measurement of height and weight. At same time is motivational interview about health and well-being. Parents will get e-mail with information before it takes place

#### **VACCINATIONS**

#### 7. Grade

Measels, Mumps and Rubella (one shot) and HPV, against human papillomavirus, (2 shots in 6 months)

#### 9. Grade

Polio, Diphteria, Pertussi and Tetanus (one shot).

Parents are asked to provide the school nurse with information about their children's vaccination. If the child is not fully vaccinated, the school health service offers the missing vaccinations

#### **MEDICATION**

If a child need medication during the school day, parents are advised to contact the school nurse.

#### **ACCIDENTS AND ILLNESS**

It is important that school nurses are aware of children who have a chronic and / or serious illness, e.g., diabetes, allergies, epilepsy, and bleeding disorders. In the event of an accident or accident during school hours, the school staff will provide first aid. If a student needs to go to a health care clinic or emergency department, the parents / guardians must accompany the child. It is therefore important that the school has all telephone numbers where parents can be reached during the child's school hours. Accidents that occur outside school hours are not expected to be dealt with by a school nurse.
